Like a lot of people of my generation, I was a bit wary of putting my credit card details online, so I hadn't really done much online shopping until a couple of years ago. You hear so much these days about people losing all their money in Internet scams. But then my niece introduced me to online grocery shopping and I haven't looked back. I was having trouble doing my weekly shopping. I don't drive, so I relied on buses and taxis to get me to the supermarket. She suggested that I do my grocery shopping online and have everything delivered to my door. Then she showed me how to set up an account and how to place the order. I couldn't believe how easy it was, to be honest. The online downside is that it costs me about £20 more per month, which really adds up. So, I find I have to budget a bit more carefully.

C **Freya**

I guess you could call me a bit old-fashioned, but I think it's really important to support local businesses. For that reason, I've never shopped online. Well, actually, that's not strictly true. I bought a wedding gift for some friends who live abroad and had that delivered to them because it was more convenient. But I get all my fruit and veg from the local market because I know most of the produce is local – and usually much cheaper than supermarket stuff. I go to the local butcher for meat and the bakery for bread. It's a bit of an effort, but I guess it's important for me to feel connected to the community I live in. I'm really against enormous global companies. It feels like local businesses find it difficult to compete, so I want to support them as much as I can.

Although my girlfriend absolutely loves clothes shopping, I really can't stand it. The worst thing of all is having to go into the changing rooms and try things on. Luckily, I haven't had to do that in a long time because I order almost all of my clothes online.
